Our CSR philosophy, Shiksha se Rojgar, means "From Education to Employment." It reflects our belief that financial empowerment is a journey built on three essentials: education, employability, and health. When these foundations are strong, individuals and households are better prepared to participate in and benefit from the formal economy.

By investing in the pillars of Education, Employability, and Health, we aim to create a long-term impact in the communities where we operate. We have aligned our CSR investments to the geographies where SBFC has operational depth – ensuring we create deep, locally relevant impact in regions like Tier II and Tier III Maharashtra, Gujarat, Rajasthan, and Madhya Pradesh.

Our CSR is not peripheral to our business. It is a natural extension of it. We finance households, but we also invest in the conditions that enable them to thrive. Whether it's a girl stepping into a new classroom, a young trainee finding their first formal job, or accessing to medical support – every one of these experiences underscores our efforts to build a financially and socially resilient India.

SBFC Shiksha (Education): Uplift of school infrastructure in aspirational districts



Shri Swaminarayan Vidyalaya, Manipura, Viramgam, Ahmedabad

In Gujarat, we enabled Shri Swaminarayan Vidyalaya to expand enrolment beyond Class 8, filling a critical education gap as government-provided schooling ends at this level.

Our support facilitated infrastructure upgrades that led to 90 new student admissions, including the introduction of Class 9 to 12.

The provision of separate washrooms helped improve inclusivity, with girl students now making up over 50% of the school's population.

This year, we also supported safe transportation so students can travel from neighbouring villages.

Government Upper Primary School Tankariya, Sirohi, Rajasthan

In Rajasthan's aspirational district of Sirohi, we focused on basic infrastructure and digital inclusion.

Our support enabled the development of four smart classrooms, a common area for mid-day meals, and separate toilets.

As a result, the school enrolled over 200 new girls, reinforcing our belief that access creates inclusion.










SBFC Gurukul (Skill): skilling for local employment

SBFC Gurukul builds aspiration, structure, and a pathway to formal employment

Each of our branches is embedded in the local economy. We finance local businesses and hire local talent who understand the language, context, and customer mindset. SBFC Gurukul, our flagship skilling programme, takes this localisation strategy further by equipping underprivileged youth with skills that are relevant to our business. Our model includes one-on-one counselling before enrolment, followed by structured induction, classroom sessions, on-the-job training, and buddy-based mentoring.













SBFC Arogya (Health): Comunity healthcare for the underserved



We believe health is a precondition for economic participation. Through this pillar, we supported Cataract Screening healthcare initiatives in FY2025, focusing on regions where public health access remains limited.

Cataract Screening and Transport: Kale Village, Kolhapur

In Maharashtra, we extended our support to the Chaitanyam Ophthalmic Institute by providing a 26-seater vehicle, significantly enhancing access to essential eye care services in the remote regions of Kolhapur.

This dedicated vehicle has enabled the seamless transportation of children from under-re-sourced schools to facilities equipped for comprehensive eye screenings. The initiative has played a pivotal role in bridging the healthcare gap in rural areas, especially for school children of marginalised farming communities.
